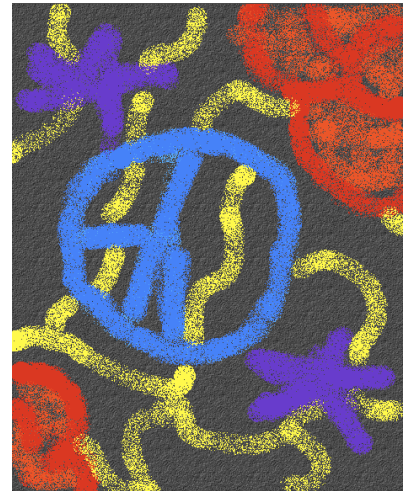

"We aren't sure. We all just wake up in the middle of the Welcomer's Woods, as they have come to be known."

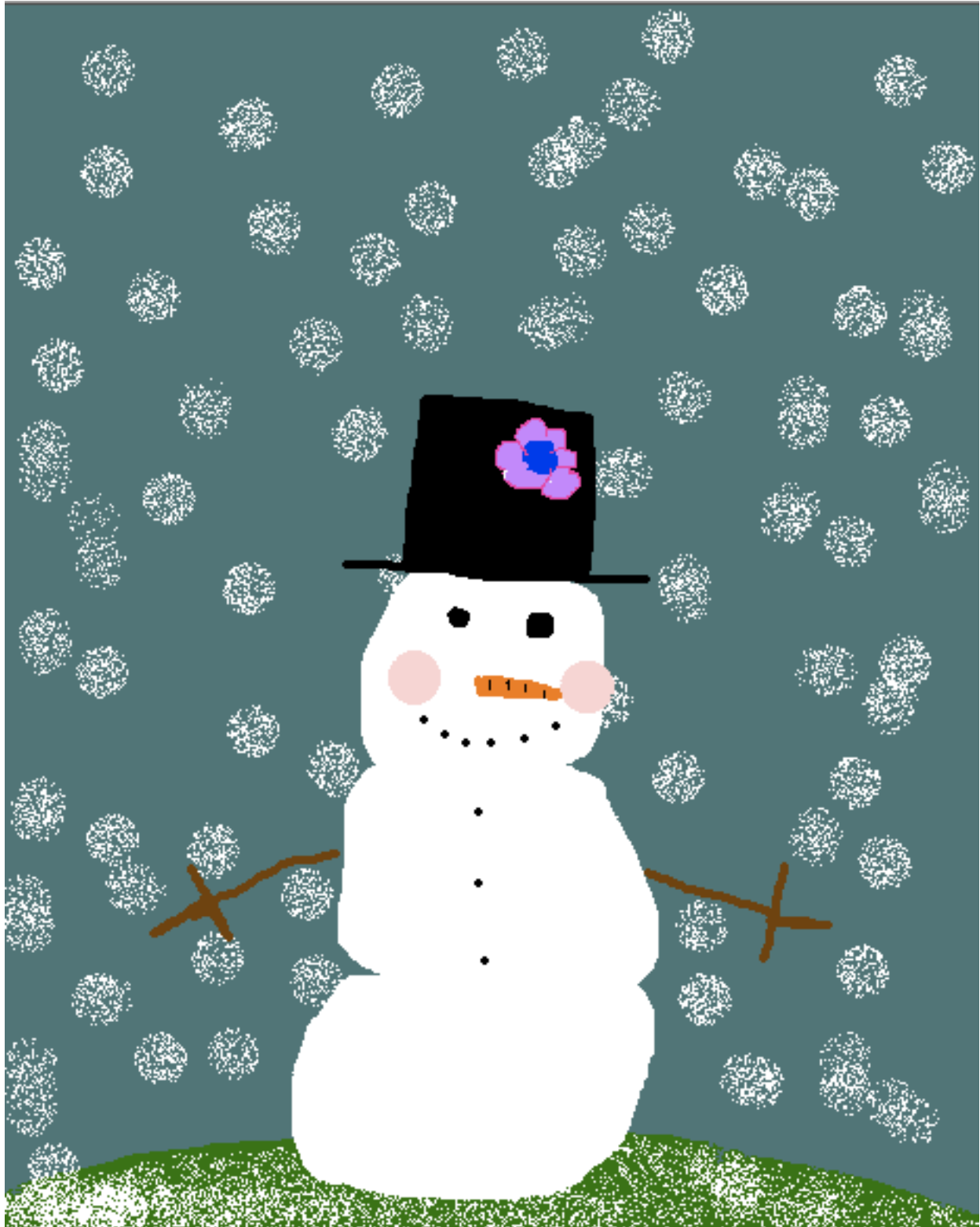
"Well the silence and eeriness is less than a warm reception." Zander let out a laugh, slipping back into his usual self.
